## TYA Audition Tips

\*Dress and act professionally at your audition, even if you know the directing staff. Be sure to put your best foot forward at all times.

\*Put thought into your audition materials. Try to choose contrasting pieces, which showcase your range as a performer. Do your best to avoid overdone monologues and songs (Ex: Charlie Brown monologues, Good Morning Baltimore, Wicked). A monologue from a play or musical is typically a better choice than one from the Internet.

\*If you are a first time auditionee, pick the material with which you are most comfortable, even if it is something mentioned above. The most important thing is for you to feel confident.

\*We want you to do well! Take deep breaths to help with nerves.

\*Don’t stop or apologize if you feel you have “messed up.” Stay confident and keep going. We all make mistakes!

\*Have your sheet music in a binder with plastic sleeves. Mark the start and end of your music in pencil if you are not doing the entire song.

\*We want to see your personality. Have fun!
